I wonder if we don't see Christ's love as much in the people he tolerated as in the pain he endured. This was truly a story of **Amazing Grace** revealed to all those around.

Judas. Why Judas betrayed his Master is really not important. Whether motivated by anger or greed, the end was the same – regret.

Pilate almost let Christ go. "Almost" with the Master, it is just as good as a "never".

The Thief on the Cross Why did Christ love him so much? This man could do nothing for Christ! Jesus' love does not depend upon what we do for him. All of us deserve heaven about as much as that crook did. No one else would give him a prayer. But in the end that is all that he had. And in the end, that is all it took.

There was some dice-throwing that went on at the foot of the cross.

Don't gamble with your soul today. Don't gamble that you even have today or another day.

John was the one who stuck with Christ. He is the only one we find at the cross. He was a simple loyal friend to Christ. He gave us John 3:16. A simple verse of God's eternal plan of salvation.

Nicodemus & Joseph of Arimathea.It's a bit ironic that the burial of Jesus should be conducted, not by those who had boasted they would never leave, but by 2 members of the Sanhedrin – 2 representatives of the religious group that killed the Messiah. All of us freed from the depths of sin and the darkness of hopelessness it brings. It's not easy to light a candle in a dark cavern. Thomas, "Doubting Thomas".

Barabbas has often been compared to humanity, and rightly so. In many ways he stands for us: a prisoner who was freed because someone he had never seen took his place. He received an underserved gift – so did we.
